Budget and Fundraising Guidelines

Fundraising is the lifeblood of our organization. These efforts make it possible to operate a quality program and keep your out-of-pocket expenses down. It is a shared responsibility among all members. As a member of SHSMBBA, you will need to pledge that your student and family will actively support all fundraising efforts.

At times we will host fundraising events which require planning, set-up, running, and taking down. We need your support to make these events possible. Some examples are Goody Table, Bingo, Car Washes, etc. We will be communicating regularly throughout the season regarding all fundraisers and how you can help

Financial Commitments

Parents are required to pay annual student membership dues of \$200. A **non-refundable deposit of \$50.00** is due at our May 21st Booster meeting if dues have not been paid yet. The remaining balance of \$150.00 can be paid in \$50 increments by the first Tuesday of the month until paid in full or you may choose to pay the dues all at once. The annual membership dues expense will be reduced by 50% for additional students of families with more than one child in the band (\$100.00).

There will also be some <u>additional expenses</u> that are not included in the budget. The General Fund covers the cost of a new student's first show shirt, shoes, gloves, and one cleaning of their uniform. One show shirt for returning members will also be provided. If your student outgrows their shoes, wants a jacket, an additional show shirt, or requires an extra cleaning of their uniform; these will be an additional expenses to be paid for by the parent. If they have student fundraising credits on their account you may use those credits to cover the cost of these additional expenses.

Students who fail to pay the annual dues will be ineligible for awards and will not be able to participate in Marching Band next year. *If assistance is needed to meet financial obligations or to work out a payment schedule please contact Brian Jacobs at* <u>bjacobs@spotsylvania.k12.va.us</u> *for a confidential meeting.*

Student Accounts

Each student member will have an account in their name to hold credits from student fundraising and to track payment of annual membership dues. These accounts are held funds. Credits will never be converted to cash to any student. Upon graduation, credits in senior accounts can be rolled into a siblings account. The sibling must be an active member or incoming participate in the following 2 years instrumental music program. They may also be transferred to another active member at the discretion of the Board. Only fundraisers designated as Student Fundraisers can be used to earn credits for student accounts. All other fundraisers will be for the General Fund. Any unused credits will not be transferred or refunded but will become part of the General Fund after the termination of an active participating member.

Student credits may be used for:

- Payment of annual student membership dues
- Payment of band trip expenses
- Payment of additional expenses associated with the cost of being a member of the Marching Band such as extra show shirts, new shoes, jacket, etc.

The Red Collection Box

A big red Collection Box is located in the band room next to Mr. Jacob's office. It is there for you to deposit any cash/check payments, notes for the Board, or fundraising information. Everything put into the Red Box should be in an envelope, clearly labeled with the student name and what it is allocated for. Credit card payments can be made by Square on our website, <u>www.spotsyhighbands.</u>org. Message will come up as a donation amount because we are a nonprofit organization. Please note who and what the payment is for.

SPOTSYLVANIA HIGH SCHOOL BAND RULES

The Spotsylvania High School Marching Band is an organization of students and staff who pride themselves in excellence. Excellence in our personal performance, our section performance, our band performance, and in the way we represent ourselves and our school. This code of conduct outlines our policies that are necessary to achieve the goals that we set for ourselves; to have pride in ourselves and others, to always perform as winners, and to work together to be truly excellent in everything that we do.

ATTENDANCE:

In order to get the most out of our rehearsals it is important to have everyone present.

- A student must be at school for at least half of the school day (two class periods) in order to participate in after-school activities (practices, performances, trips, etc.) Students should make every effort to attend school.
- Band members are expected to attend all marching band functions. The only acceptable reasons
 for missing a practice or performance are illness or a death in the family. Absences can be
 excused with appropriate notice to Mr. Jacobs no less than a week before the missed event.
 Mark your personal calendar now with those dates that have been outlined above.
- A copy of the band calendar can be found at <u>www.spotsyhighbands.</u>org. Check it often. Missing a practice or performance (unless excused in advance by Mr. Jacobs) can be cause for dismissal from the marching band.
- Each band member will be allowed one excused absence from practice but not a competition. An absence is excused only if it is cleared with Mr. Jacobs ahead of time. In cases where advance notice is impossible, a note must be brought in by the band member the next day explaining their absence. This excused absence is for practices only; not for games, parades or competitions.
- Students who miss practice more than once in a week will not be allowed to perform with the ensemble that weekend including: Football Games and Competitions.

• Students with chronic absences will be removed from the program. We will be enforcing a <u>three</u> <u>strikes and you're out policy</u> this year.

GAMES:

When we wear the uniform of the Spotsylvania High School Marching Band, we are representing not only ourselves, but our band and school. We should wear the uniform in such a way that everyone who sees us will know the pride we feel for each other, for our band, and for our school.

- The marching band will march into the stands before the game and will march to the band room (at home games) or the buses (at away games) after the game.
- Sections will sit together in the stands. **NO ONE** will be allowed in the band section of the stands who is not a band member or band parent.
- When travelling all students are required to ride the bus to and from events. Some exceptions can be made with prior approval from Mr. Jacobs.
- The band will be given the third quarter off to go to the concession stand, restrooms, etc. When the game clock shows the end of the third quarter, everyone should be back in the stands in their section, ready to play.

UNIFORMS:

Remember you are representing yourself, the band, and the school while wearing the uniform.

- The SHS band uniform consists of the following:
 - Horns/Percussion/Instrument playing members Jacket, pants (bibs), show shirt, black shoes, black socks, black gloves, and shako (hat)/plume.
 - Pit Crew Pit Crew polo, blue jeans, and tennis shoes.
 - Auxiliary Uniform, hair accessories, make-up, shoes, tights, etc. as directed by the Auxiliary Coach.
- We must always wear our uniforms the same way. In case of warmer weather; jackets, gloves, and hats may be removed but only at the direction of Mr. Jacobs or the Drum Major.
- It is acceptable to wear winter coats over the band uniform, except during performances.
- Baseball hats or other types of non-uniform hats are not acceptable while in uniform.
- Band members will not be allowed to remove their uniform jacket if they are not wearing their band show shirt underneath.
- The band uniform is to be hung neatly on a hangar and placed in your garment bag when not being worn. Students are not allowed to take uniforms home with them.

BUSES:

All Spotsylvania County bus rules apply to all trips.

- Proper and courteous behavior is expected at all times.
- Students are to ride the bus home from every event. Only prior written approval from Mr. Jacobs will be allowed.
- Public displays of affection can make others uncomfortable and is not acceptable behavior at any time.
- Phones or other such devices may be played at moderate volume while traveling; however, if the bus driver or chaperone requests that the volume be turned down, then it needs to be immediately.

Because progress is essential to achieving excellence, a strict policy on behavior is necessary. Anything that hinders our progress keeps us away from our goal of excellence. Since to list every inappropriate action or define every appropriate alternative would be impossible, the following three statements are guidelines designed to help students in choosing their course of action.

TO ACHIEVE EXCELLENCE, WE MUST HAVE ...

An environment conducive to learning: In a large group, problems, minor or serious, distract us from focusing our attention on the task at hand. Enforcement of rules helps us to eliminate distractions.

- A band to be proud of: When you are surrounded by people who are dedicated to the same goal as you are, and you have all the right tools to work with, excellence is an attainable goal. Being a member of the band means doing more than just going through the motions. Behaving responsibly, knowing that your actions as a member of the band reflect on every other member, being on time, having a positive attitude, and working productively toward our goals, will make progress possible and failure impossible.
- An organization that works: The student leader staff is comprised of band members who have been members for more than one year. They have committed themselves to excellence in their performance and wish the same for all band members. They are responsible to the members of their section or to the band as a whole, to ensure members are on task and working to improve our performance.

Code of Conduct

• Be kind, supportive and fair to one another!

- Respect the Band Director, coaches, chaperones, adults and fellow band members.
- Attend all Marching Band practices, performances, award assemblies, and competitions.
- School rules apply to all students and parents no matter where we are.
- Follow all bus rules as laid out by the bus driver.
- Remain in the stadium for all games, performances, and competitions. If you leave the stadium for any reason, you must have an adult escort.
- Sit in the SHS section of the stands for the awards ceremony at every performance or competition.
- Keep your uniform, instrument and equipment clean, neat, and accessible at all times. Wear athletic/gym shorts while changing in mixed company. Boxers, leotards, flesh-colored unitards, revealing bras or underclothing are not permitted in mixed company. Students must wear shoes on their feet at all times. Sandals are not permitted during practice. Tennis shoes or similar closed shoes must be worn.
- Students must be passing all classes to participate in band.
- Report any concerns to an adult immediately. The incident will be documented and given to the Band Director for further investigation. The Band Director will handle any referrals or disciplinary action.
